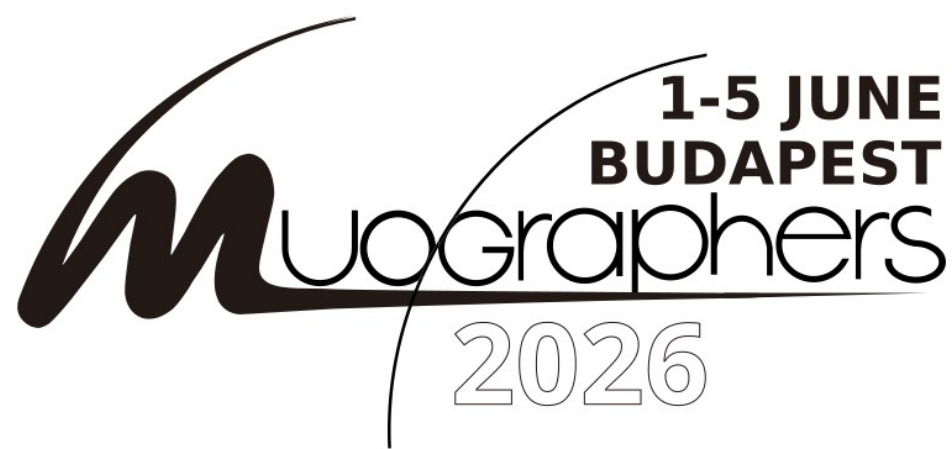

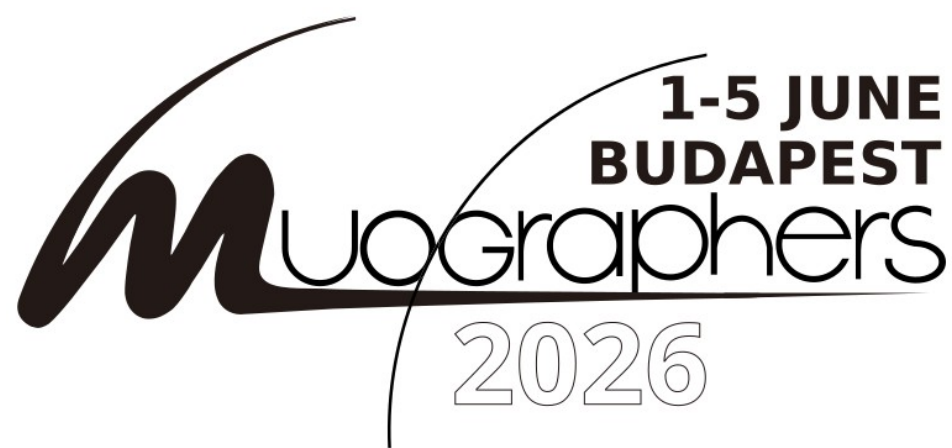

Bence Rábóczy's Recommendations near the hotel

- **Marischka Restaurant** – A modern bistro that reinterprets traditional Hungarian cuisine in an elegant contemporary style. Its cozy terrace and creative cocktail selection make it an excellent choice for dinner or evening gatherings.
Estimated price range: €15–45 per person
Public transport from Mercure Budapest Castle Hill: approx. 10–15 minutes
- **Rojt és Bojt Coffee** – A stylish specialty coffee shop with a calm and welcoming atmosphere near the Castle District. The café is especially popular for its high-quality coffee, brunch menu, and elegant interior design.
Estimated price range: €5–10 per person
Public transport from Mercure Budapest Castle Hill: approx. 10 minutes.
- **Buja Disznó(k) Buda** – A casual bistro focused on Hungarian comfort food, famous for its oversized schnitzels and hearty dishes. It is a great place to experience the more relaxed, street-food-inspired side of Hungarian cuisine.
Estimated price range: €10–15 per person
Public transport from Mercure Budapest Castle Hill: approx. 20–25 minutes.
- **Rudas Bistro** – Located next to the historic Rudas Thermal Bath, this panoramic restaurant offers stunning views over the Danube and downtown Pest. Its modern dishes are particularly enjoyable around sunset.
Estimated price range: €15–45 per person
Public transport from Mercure Budapest Castle Hill: approx. 15–20 minutes.
- **Déryné** – One of Budapest's best-known classic bistros, combining the atmosphere of a Parisian café with refined Hungarian hospitality. A popular meeting spot for breakfast, business lunches, or evening wine and cocktails.
Estimated price range: €25–60 per person
Public transport from Mercure Budapest Castle Hill: approx. 10 minutes (or around 15 minutes on foot).

Bence Rábóczy's Recommendations on the Bartók Béla Boulevard

- Zenta Kraft by Etyeki – A gastropub specializing in craft beer, offering beers from the Etyek brewery alongside burgers and bistro-style dishes. Its friendly and modern atmosphere makes it a great evening destination.

Estimated price range: €10–15 per person

Public transport from Mercure Budapest Castle Hill: approx. 20–25 minutes.

- Black Dog Pub – A relaxed neighborhood pub with a wide beer selection and a welcoming social atmosphere. A good option for informal evening meetups and drinks.

Estimated price range: €5–15 per person

Public transport from Mercure Budapest Castle Hill: approx. 25 minutes.

- Palack Wine Bar – A cozy and sophisticated wine bar specializing in small-batch wines. Its intimate atmosphere and carefully curated wine selection make it an excellent spot for relaxed evening conversations and discovering local wine culture.

Estimated price range: €10–30 per person

Public transport from Mercure Budapest Castle Hill: approx. 15–20 minutes.

- Kelet Kávészó és Galéria – An iconic cultural café with bookshelves, gallery space, and a relaxed atmosphere. An ideal place for conversations over coffee.

Estimated price range: €5–10 per person

Public transport from Mercure Budapest Castle Hill: approx. 20–25 minutes.

- Moto Pizza Bartók – A Neapolitan-style pizzeria with a modern and youthful vibe in the heart of Bartók Béla Boulevard. Perfect for a casual dinner or a quick but high-quality Italian meal.

Estimated price range: €5–15 per person
